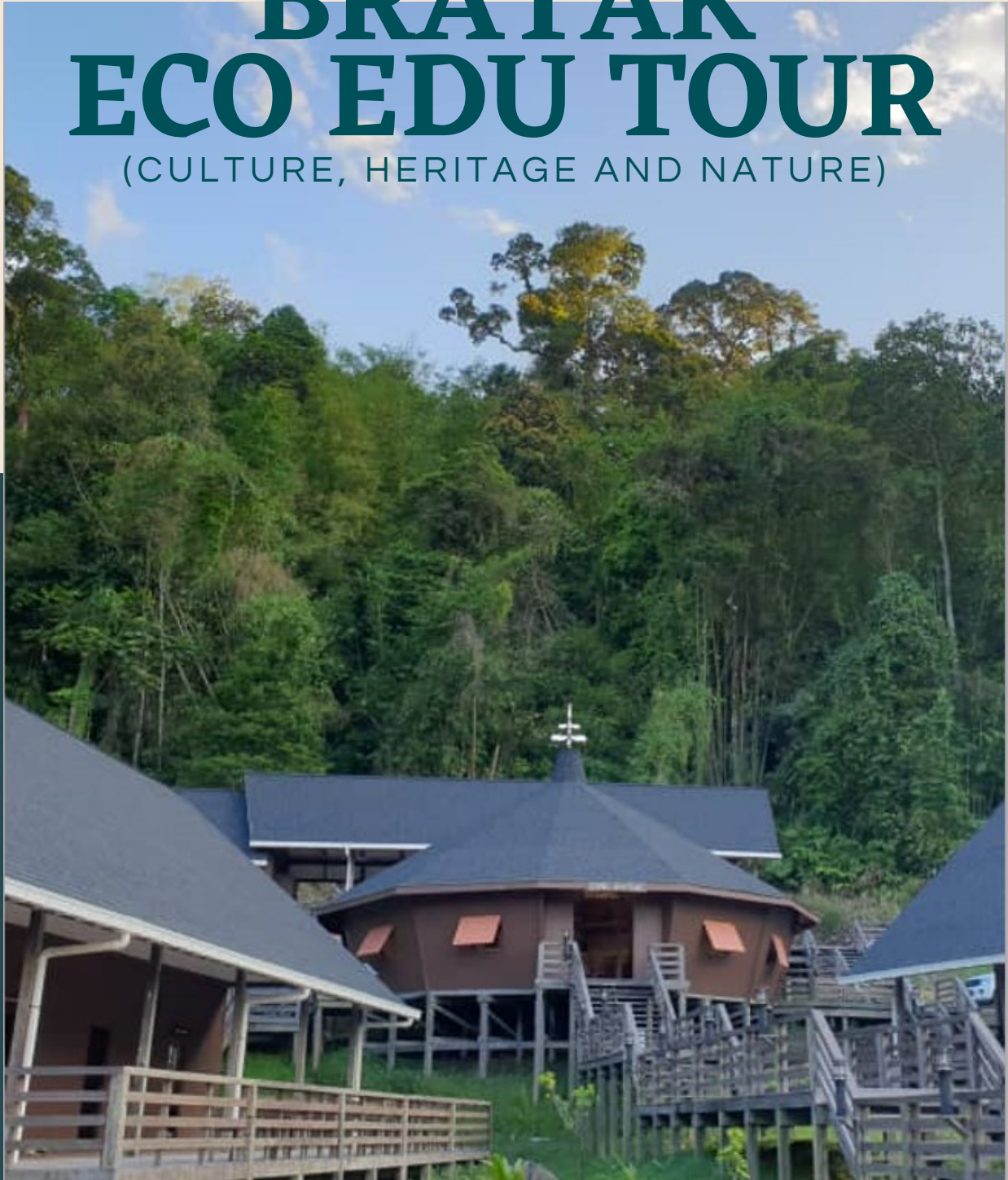

About BUNG BRATAK



Bung Bratak is surrounded by nature and located at Kampung Tembawang Sauh, Bau, Sarawak. It is a popular spot for hikers and campers.

Bung Bratak means Bratak Hill, and it represents what was once a large Bidayuh hill settlement of seven longhouses. Over 750 years ago, a group of Bidayuhs from Sungkong (now at interior of West Kalimantan, Indonesia) settled at Bung Bratak in search of ample land for paddy planting.

Beginning from 1841, the Bung Bratak settlers started to move downhill to neighbouring places. 35 Bidayuh villages of Jagoi-Bratak group in the Bau and Lundu Districts of Sarawak originated from Bung Bratak.

The Bung Bratak Heritage Centre (BBHC) was initiated and developed by the Bung Bratak Heritage Association (BBHA). It is built 1,000 feet above sea level, and as the first-of-its-kind in Borneo to be built on a hilltop.

Bung Bratak is fully funded by the Ministry of Tourism and Culture. Interestingly the Bung Bratak Heritage Centre is built on what is deemed to be the original ancestral home of the Jagoi-Bratak sub-group of the Bidayuhs.

The centre comprises of two traditional longhouses, a Bidayuh traditional round house known as the 'baruk', a dining hall with kitchen and a reception hall.

The best way to learn about a culture is to be part of it!

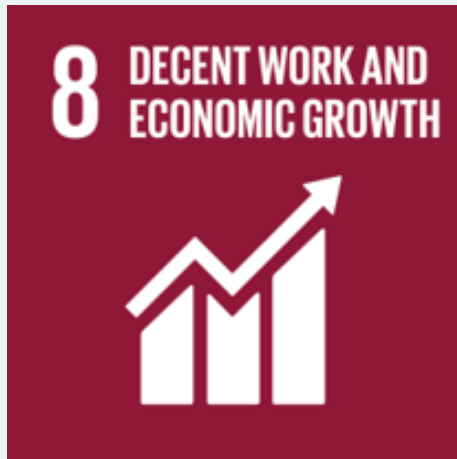
